In March 2015, we trained volunteers and opened our doors in faith. And people came: families from the community, men and women who live out-of-doors, young people, people looking for a job, a shower, a cup of coffee. Volunteers were there to greet them, to listen to them, to share stories and memories. Our goal has always been to provide a safe place for people, those with homes, those seeking homes, and those without homes.

2016, our second year of operation, was full of challenges and opportunities:

- We changed the entrance to the facility, allowing an outside gathering place for guests
- We hosted our first service provider day where 18 organizations came and offered information to over 50 people who attended
- We held our second annual garage sale which raised \$13,139 for the Center
- We provided space for staff from the Free Clinics to serve our guests


